How quickly can you learn a language? - a lot quicker than you think!

A local author has been working for some years with Greenwich University to produce a new artificial language (similar principle to Esperanto). It is intended to be much simpler and quicker to learn than natural languages, with the ultimate aim that it could become the main form of communication for international use.

A trial course at Greenwich showed that people could pick up the basic grammar in only 15 hours of teaching. We have successfully completed a more extensive 30 hour (20 week) course with U3A in Bournemouth, which our participants found very enjoyable, and we'd like to repeat the course next term.
